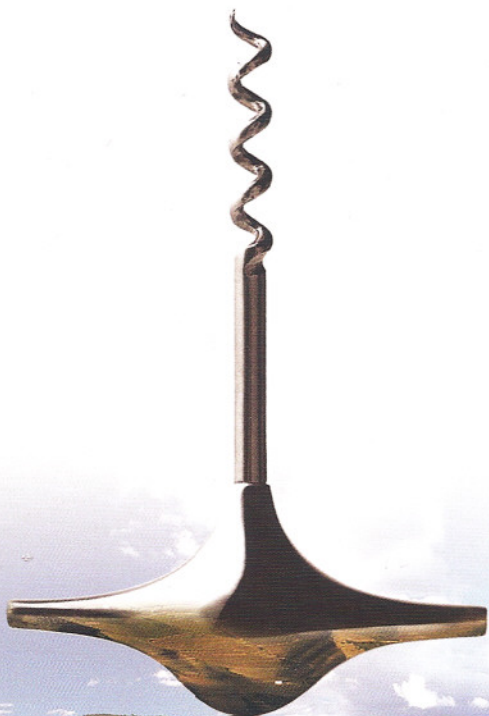

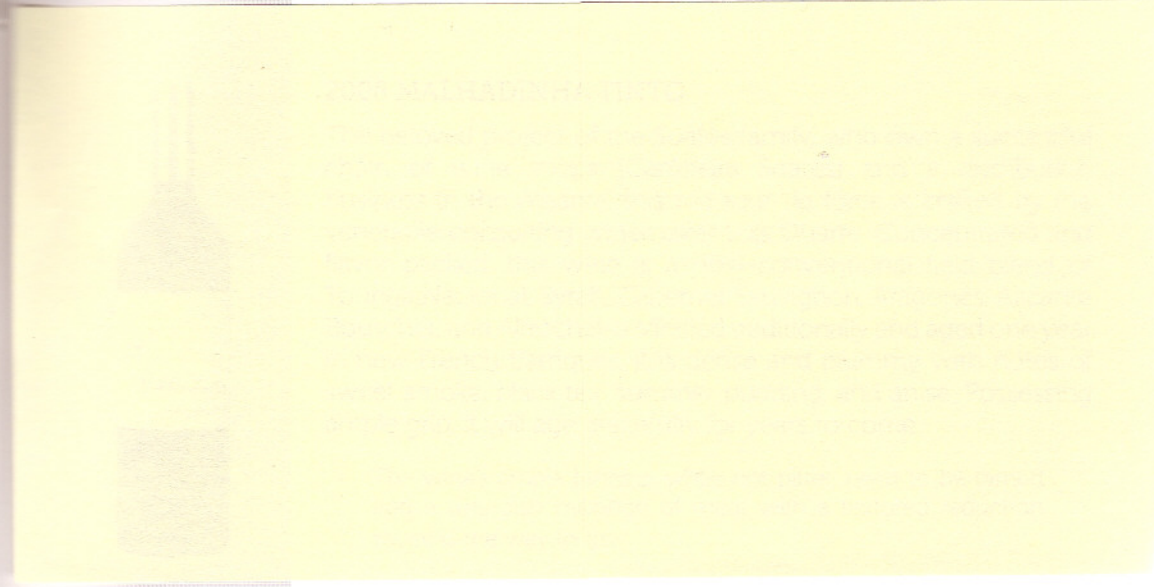

The wine is a blend of 40% Aragonés, 40% Alicante Bouschet, 10% Touriga Nacional, and 10% Cabernet Sauvignon. Mild aromas of ripe dark fruits and the hints of winter spices and chocolate are further enhanced by notes of toasty oak and black tea. This is definitely a wine to be cellared as it only teases you with what promises to develop in the years to come. It is aromatically restrained and powerfully structured with serious amount of firm tannins. Definitely a keeper!

Grilled steaks, preferably New York or rib-eye, accompanied by root vegetables or simply grilled hamburgers, for sure!
